

What next?

Sell your grain

- Your local cooperative will buy your corn today for \$3.00 per bushel.
- They will dock \$0.05 for every percentage of moisture from 15%-25% moisture.
- They will dock \$0.08 for every percentage of moisture over 25%.

Store your grain

- Your local cooperative will allow you to store your grain on site until you wish to sell it. They will charge \$0.18 per bushel for the first 80 days, and \$0.02 for every day after.
- Some farmers have their own grain bins to store their grain. The price of building the bin can vary between \$35,000 and \$50,000.

Dry your grain

- If you choose to sell your grain when it is above 15% moisture, the cooperative will dry the grain using the cost docked per bushel.
- Your local cooperative will dry your grain for you if you pay the regular storage price, plus an additional drying fee.
- You can add a grain dryer to your grain bin for an extra dollar per bushel that the bin can hold.
