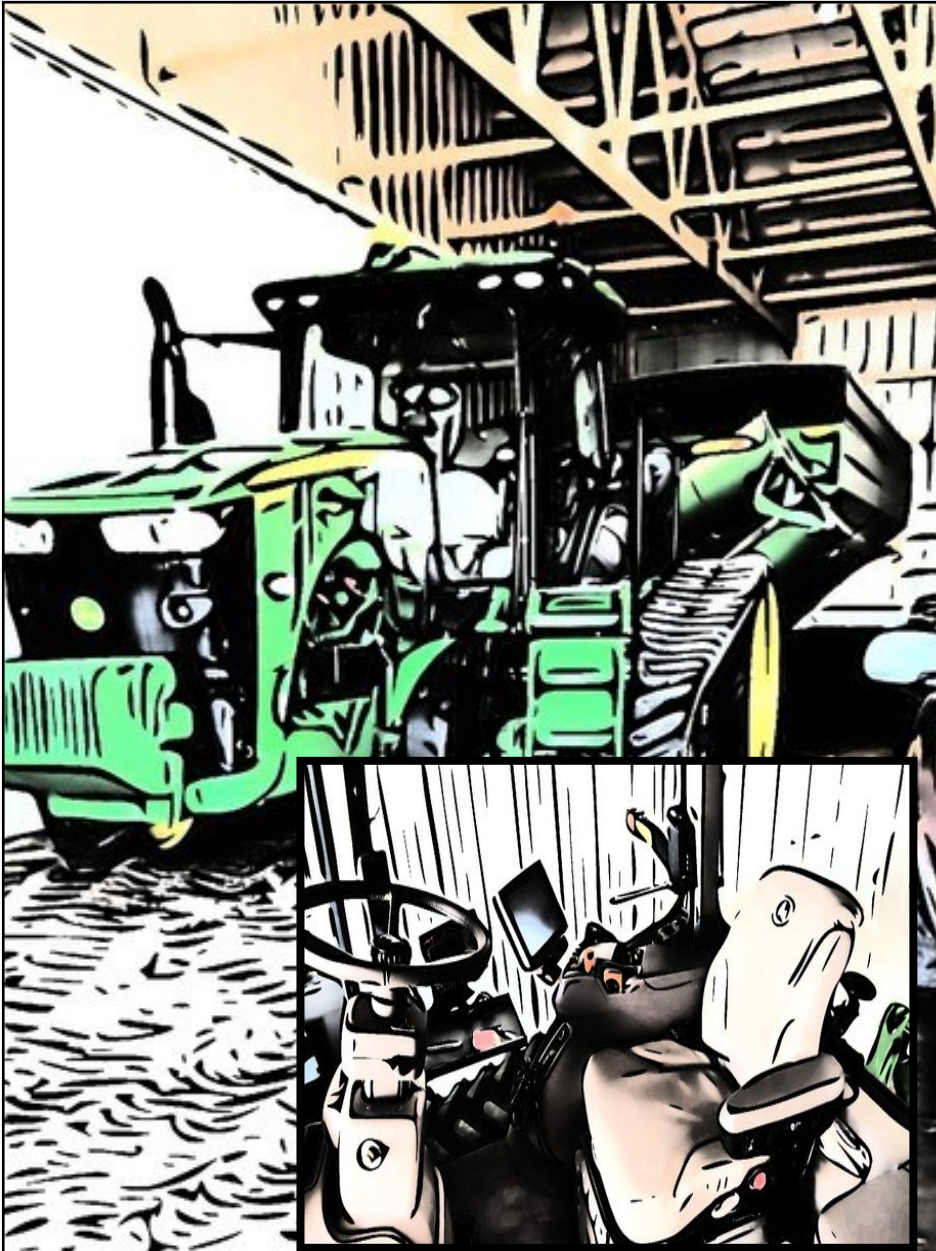
All superheroes have special powers, even the farmer.

The farmer has duplication powers.



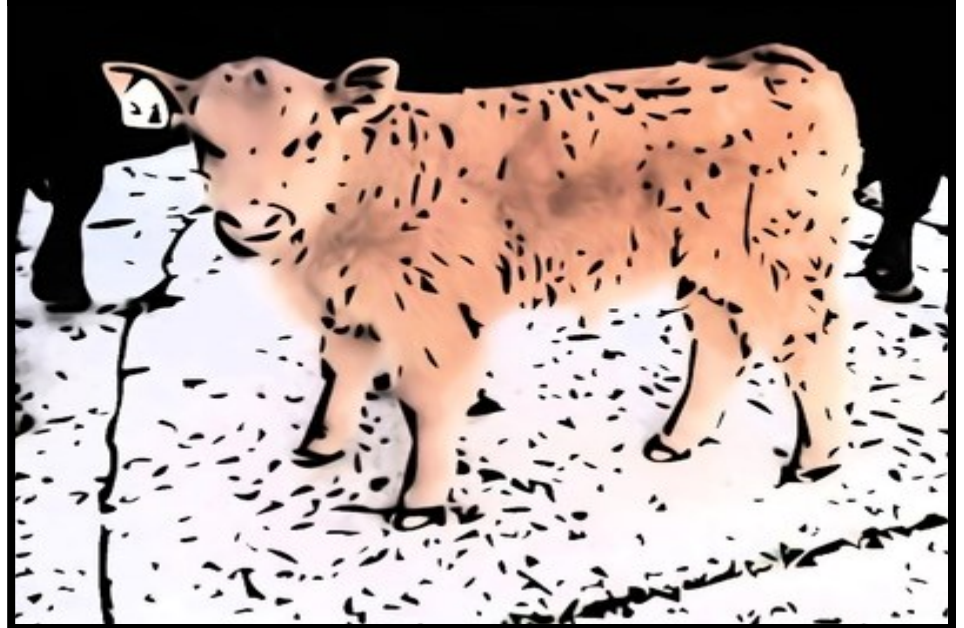
If an animal is sick, the farmer takes care of it and helps it feel better.
